OVERALL REPORT OF THE PROGRAMME:

BARASAT COLLEGE, Barasat, North 24-Parganas started its journey in a humble way in the year 1972 with the sole motto of socio-cultural and educational upliftment of the adjoining urban and rural areas of Barasat. Barasat College, a co-educational college, was initially affiliated by the University of Calcutta under the name 'Barasat Evening College' on 21st Nov 1972. Honours Course in Accounting and Finance was introduced in the session 1978-79 and honours in Marketing Course started in 2002-03. With the passage of time the need was felt to introduce Humanities stream and it was introduced in the day section in the session 1988-89 with B.A pass course - subjects offered were Bengali, English, Political Science, Philosophy, Education and History. Gradually Honours courses in Humanities were introduced. The Science stream with honours course in Geography and pass courses in Pure Science, Bio-Science and Computer Science have been introduced in 2003-04 and 2004-05 respectively. In the past our college was affiliated to Calcutta University. After the formation of West Bengal State University for the district of North 24-Parganas in 2008 our college has come under the affiliation of this new University. In the Session 2012-13 Honours in Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Zoology, Botany and Computer Science were added to our journey of education. From infinite number of Teaching & Non-Teaching Staff, Students, Local Administrators and Stakeholders, it has reached its present colossal status. It has outshined many academic institutions in spite of its humble infrastructure and goes on collecting accolades as usual, as days go

Ever since its inception, the college has been trying to achieve excellence and fulfil the objectives as envisaged in the NSS activities.

The Free Eye Check-up Programme for Students, Teaching and Non Teaching Staff as well as Alumni was held in the 2nd half after the blood donation camp in the common block of the College Office on 18th January 2018. Due to the growing intensity of eye -related diseases all over the world, particularly in the Third World Countries, it was thought imperative that an Eye- checkup Camp within the College premises will have far-reaching effects. Most of the Teachers and Non-Teaching Staff of the College drive two wheelers or four wheelers;

imperative that an Eye Checkup Camp would address the variegated needs of the Teaching, Non-Teaching and Students of the College, in these era of eye disorders of various types. Colour blindness is an all pervasive disease; in Government Services and Services procurable through Competitive Examination, passing an eye test is a must.

Most of the students of the college come from the very poor families, which cannot afford prolonged and expensive eye treatments. The College saw to it that they do not have to pay any dimoctor fees. Therefore, their enthusiasm took in a new silver liming, as in the programme they did not have to pay anything from their pocket. They assembled wholeheartedly, and occupied tge Classrooms, from where they were called as per seniority for the Eye checkup, monitored by Doctors if repute and expertise. The Teachers and the Non-Teaching allowed tge Students to be attended first, as they patiently wsited fir their turns. The Doctors had brought in several sophisticated medical equipments, which they arranged adequately, before starting the subtle test of the eyes of every person of the College, who had assembled.

All the NSS volunteers, teaching and non-teaching staff has performed and took the responsibility for their own capabilities. Every NSS volunteers contributed their personal roles as per NSS guide line and on the other hand Programme Officer of the College's used his expertise and skill for successfully completed the entire programme. All assembled in the College premises and NSS volunteers were given the esteemed hospitality for the programme with nursing, fooding and other take responsibility. The Program was a great success and all opined that such programs should be held every year, so that the College can be irradiated from all kinds of eye problems. The Doctors were honoured by the College with honorary scarfs and mementos, for their selfless help, free of cost.

At the occasion, the Principal gave a small speech about tge utility of such programs and also read out Milton's poem 'On His Blindness'. Prof. Tirthankar Dalui, Head of the Department of Zoology also spoke of the various kinds of eye diseases, and about tge remedies available in India.
